The SEC Conflict Minerals Rule pursuant to Section 13(p), Rule 13p-1 and Form SD does not constitute a general prohibition on the use of specific minerals. It requires certain SEC reporting companies to disclose and conduct a reasonable country-of-origin inquiry and, where applicable, due diligence if tin, tantalum, tungsten or gold are necessary to the functionality or production of their products.

FATH GmbH supports corresponding customer requests by conducting supply-chain inquiries using the current reporting templates of the Responsible Minerals Initiative. The Conflict Minerals Reporting Template CMRT is used for tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold. The Extended Minerals Reporting Template EMRT is used for cobalt, copper, natural graphite, lithium, natural mica and nickel.

As of the review date, CMRT version 6.6 and EMRT version 2.11 are used. The original template used and the supplier declarations received are documented together with the relevant version and reporting year.
